Year 7	Stage 3	What is your school like? (What do you like/dislike and why?) Describe a typical school day. What is your opinion of your school subjects and why? In each stage you have a set of Key Questions you will be able to answer accurately and fluently by the end of the stage. These key questions come from a range of topic areas and by studying these topic areas, your vocabulary range will develop.
